At the end of the reporting period 31 December 2018 the balance on the General Fund had increased by £178 to a total of £313 and the balance on the Path Wardens Fund was unchanged at £2,169.

Trustee recruitment and appointment

Trustees are recruited on a voluntary basis from amongst the wider pool of countryside volunteers (who carry out practical maintenance tasks, which form the basis for the group's creation).

Objectives and activities

Charitable purposes

Our mission is to support, promote and expand the contribution of our volunteers in protecting and enhancing the East Lothian countryside, its wildlife, heritage and accessibility for the wellbeing of our communities and all the people of East Lothian.

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objects

We support and promote a wide range of nature conservation activities including the work of nine volunteer groups. Volunteer activities we supported in the year included: litter picking, removing invasive plant species, maintaining core paths and improving local accessibility, planting trees and hedges, surveying vulnerable plant and animal species and looking after grazing animals that are helping towards bringing more flowering plants to our grasslands.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Trustees and membership

At December 2018 the charity had 103 registered volunteer members.

The Trustees had five meetings during the year and the AGM was held in December 2018. The AGM was attended by the Trustees and forty volunteers were present as well. The Trustees stood down and then they were nominated and seconded to take up their positions. The office bearers Secretary, Treasurer and Chair were all re-elected.

We have a <u>website</u> and <u>Facebook site</u> to publicise and promote our work. They illustrate the wide range of conservation activities we undertook in 2018 conjunction with the Countryside Ranger service of East Lothian Council.

Projects and funding

Over the year, as in previous years, volunteers contributed thousands of hours of countryside conservation and maintenance work through the established network of local groups that work in partnership with the East Lothian Council ranger service. An indication of the diverse range of these activities can be found at our website www.elcv.org.uk/tasks/.

In addition to this continuing core work we obtained and applied external funding for two specific conservation projects.

In March and April 2018 we secured £9,000 grant from East Lothian Council area partnership funding for major improvements to the footpath alongside the A6137 running North-South between Haddington outskirts and Alderston Mains. Funding provided for renovation of the pathway, installation of new fencing and sundry tools and equipment for the project.

In May 2018 we secured £1,000 grant funding from Butterfly Conservation Scotland. This was of vital assistance to an ongoing project to relocate a colony of Grayling butterflies from the soon-to-be-redeveloped former opencast mine at Blindwells near Tranent to a newly created and sustainable site at Levenhall Links. The Grayling is a species of high conservation concern and the successfully relocated colony is one of only two Grayling colonies in East Lothian. The grant paid for essential landscaping at the receptor site.

The Trustees sought to progress two other major projects during the year. The first was the Volunteer Hub for Aberlady Local Nature Reserve. A sub group was established to lead on this to prepare a proposal for discussion with the East Lothian Planning Department, landowners and potential funders. There was strong support for the project, with funding offers of $\sim \pm 3500$ achieved in the year (and planning permission obtained in 2019). But we have so far been unable to secure the balance of $\pm 15,000$ required to fully fund the project.

The second project is to seek the eradication of three invasive plants in the River Tyne catchment. The priority is to first tackle Giant Hogweed because of its risk to the public who can be burnt by the plants sap if they are exposed to UV. There is also a desire to eradicate Japanese Knotweed and Himalayan Balsam in due course. Volunteers joined forces with the 70 land managers who agreed to spray the Giant Hogweed in the in the Spring/Summer of 2019. The volunteers' main role is to survey and report to the coordinator of the land managers who will then go out to spray.

Other developments

Friends of the River Tyne is a charitable group that has been concerned with flooding in Haddington and was also looking after the River Tyne in Haddington. They have now focussed their work on the River Tyne and have decided to come under the ELCV umbrella.

Financial review

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves	The charity has a small surplus £2,842 at the year-end, of which we accumulated £2,163 during our previous existence as a charity exclusively concerned with Path Warden activities. Accordingly £2,163 is reserved by the Trustees to be spent on similar activities in the future. As the charity grows its assets may expand, in which case the trustees will agree the level of reserves that are sufficient to hold in order meet any outstanding payments or as money set aside to fund specific future needs and contingencies.
